The CleanTech Forum II presents your company with a unique opportunity to showcase your interest and support in developing Malaysia's renewable energy infrastructure. This Forum builds on the success of the CleanTech Forum I held in Kuala Lumpur in 2023.

The Forum will be graced with the presence of the U.S. Ambassador to Malaysia, His Excellency Edgard D. Kagan.

Malaysia's transition to implement Clean Energy includes the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions and carbon management. With more than 500 offshore oil and gas wells nearing their end of life, most of which are in Sarawak, Malaysia sees the opportunity to use these subsurface reservoirs as storage sites for carbon captured from countries like Japan and South Korea. Hence, Carbon Capture and Storage (CCS) will be a significant industry in Malaysia. By placing this program adjacent to the Asia Pacific Green Hydrogen Conference, we will also explore the opportunities Sarawak presents for developing Green Hydrogen.
