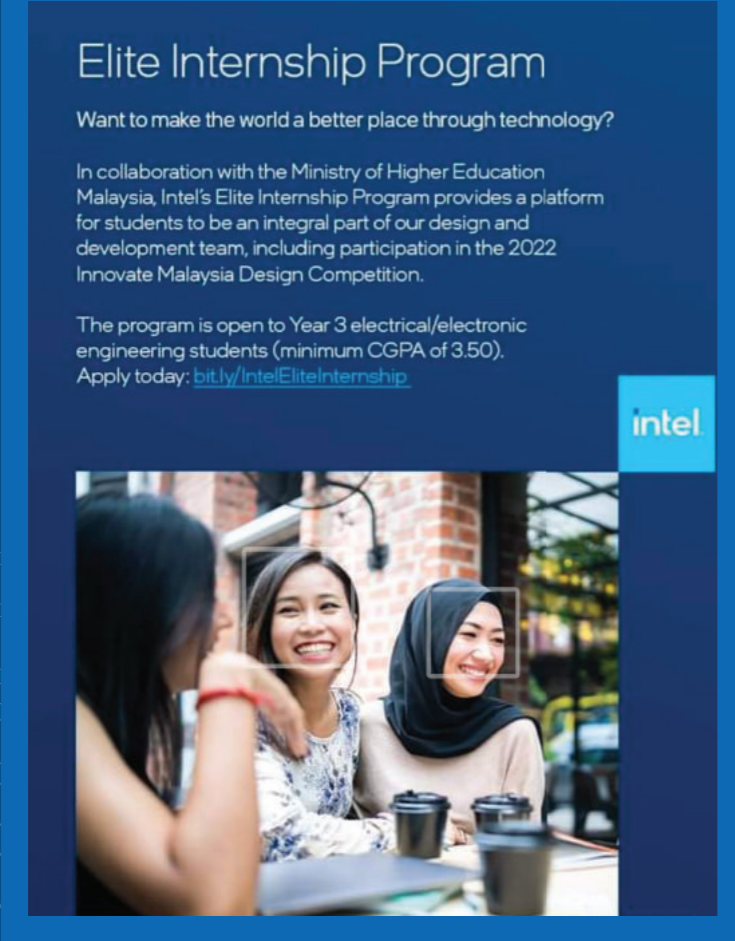


Helping Our Youths Build Strong Careers

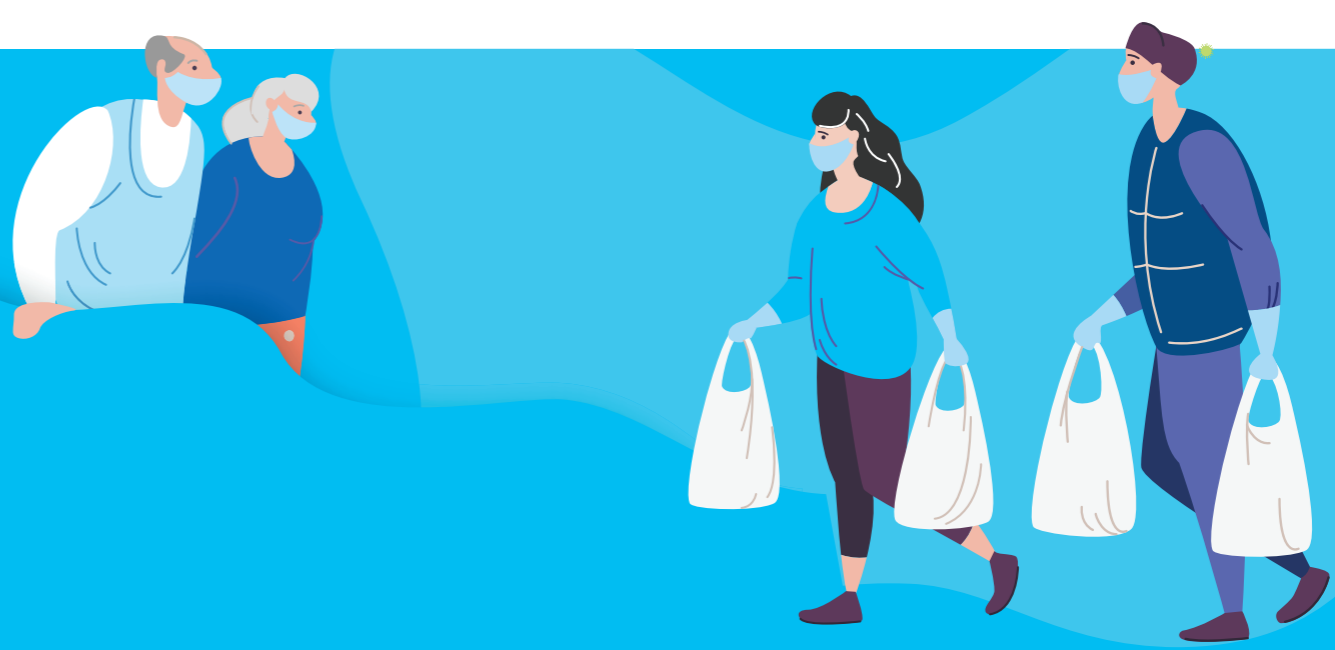

Driving Vaccination Efforts

The Intel Malaysia COVID-19 Immunization Program (IMCIP) vaccination which began on July 12th was successfully completed for our employees and employees from external companies. Here's a quick look at the numbers:

- Total vaccinations completed for Phase 1 and 2:
- Kulim: around 3600 employees
- Penang: around 8600 employees
- Intel Malaysia (in total): around 12,200 employees
- External companies: around 5,400 employees
